Youth Employment Programs

















STEP provides:

- Training and support to youth who self-identify with employment barriers including mental health challenges.
- One-on-one employment counselling, job coaching and paid work placement opportunities.
- Certifications in Smart Serve, First Aid/ CPR, WHMIS, and Food Handlers.

EVERY BITE MATTERS (EBM)

- EBM is a paid 12 week youth employment program that provides culinary training while promoting social inclusivity in the community.
- EBM includes 2 weeks of preemployment workshops, 6 weeks in the 360°kids kitchen where participants further develop culinary skills, and a 4 week job placement with a community employer.



YOUTH SUCCESS STRATEGY (YSS)

YSS Employment Counselling assists youth in reaching their employment goals who

- 1. do not require the supports of a formal program or;
- 2. do not meet eligibility criteria of our formal programs.

BASE 4 SUCCESS

- Base 4 Success is a paid 12 week employment program consisting of pre-employment workshops, life skills and employment placement.
- Included are certifications in Smart Serve, First Aid/CPR, WHMIS, and Food Handlers and a one day excursion.

YOUTH JOB CONNECTION (YJC)

YJC provides:

- paid pre-employment workshops, and placement support for youth with barriers to employment.
- 60 hour (minimum) pre-employment training must be completed before an employment opportunity can begin.



YJC SUMMER (YJCS)

- YJCS supports secondary school students through employability skills training and part-time employment opportunities that identify with barriers to employment.
- 20 hour minimum pre-employment training must be completed before an employment placement can be provided.
